ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA SIGNS CONVENTION ON THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MARITIME AIDS TO NAVIGATION (IALA)

On January 26th, 2022, 26 States signed the Convention on the International Organization for the Marine Aids to Navigation (IALA) at a signing ceremony which took place at the IALA headquarters in Saint-Germain-en-Laye, near Paris. The ceremony was hosted by the Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs representing the Depositary, the Government of France.

IALA is a non-profit, international technical association. Established in 1957, it gathers together Marine Aids to Navigation authorities, manufacturers, consultants and scientific and training institutes from all parts of the world and offers them the opportunity to exchange and compare their experiences and achievements.

IALA encourages its members to work together in a common effort to harmonize Marine Aids to Navigation worldwide and to ensure that the movements of vessels are safe, expeditious and cost-effective while protecting the environment.

The prestigious ceremony marked the end of the one-year signature period which commenced on January 27th, 2021, in Paris which, as the Depositary State, was the first to sign the Convention.
