The 28th Caribbean Memorandum of Understanding on Port State Control (CMOU) Annual Committee **Meeting Hosted in Antigua**

ST. JOHN'S June 30th, 2023 - The 28th Meeting of the Caribbean Port State Control Committee (CPSCC) was held over the period 29 to 30 June 2023 at the St. James Club and Villas, Mamora Bay. The meeting was hosted by the Antigua and Barbuda Department of Marine Services and Merchant Shipping (ADOMS) on behalf of the Government of Antigua and Barbuda.

The Caribbean Memorandum of Understanding on Port State Control (CMOU) was signed in 1996 Christchurch, Barbados with a mandate to eliminate the operation of substandard ships in the Caribbean region through a harmonized system of port State control.

This year's meeting focused on proposing amendments to the applicability of the Code of Safety for Caribbean Cargo Ships (CCSS Code). This annual meeting was delivered in a hybrid format with delegates from eighteen of the twenty member States, the Associate Member State of the British Virgin Islands, and the Observer State of Montserrat participating. The Regional Coordinator Caribbean of the International Maritime (IMO) well Organization as representatives from the United States Coast Guard and the Paris Memorandum of Understanding on Port State Control (PMOU) were also in attendance. The Memorandum Indian Ocean Understanding on Port State Control (IOMOU), the Tokyo Memorandum of Understanding on Port State Control, and the Viňa del Mar Agreement were able to participate virtually.

The Mediterranean Memorandum of Understanding on Port State Control (MED MOU) and the Black Memorandum of Understanding on Port Control were accepted Observers to the CMOU at this year's committee meeting.
